Mr. and Mrs. James W. Fenn, formerly of 1786 Graefield road have moved to their new home at 1900 Washington Blvd.

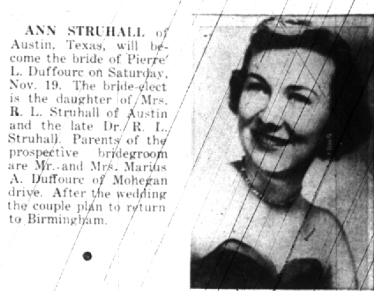
