

Members Note Pastor's 25th Anniversary

Observing his silver anniversary as an ordained minister of the Lutheran church, members of the Rev. Theodore Wuggazer's Revere church congregation honored him at a surprise party Sunday evening.

A special service was planned with his two brothers and son taking part. The Rev. E. W. Wuggazer of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, preached the sermon, while the Rev. Martin Wuggazer of Heron Springs,

gave the anniversary prayer. Duane Wuggazer, planning to follow in his father's footsteps, presided at the liturgy.

Mr. Wuggazer was ordained on Oct. 12, 1930, and came to Birmingham the following year after a brief pastorate at Emblem, Wyo.

THE CHURCH membership has grown from 35 persons to more than 800. It has moved to a larger church on W. Maple, a colonial

type structure frequently spoken of as "the picture postcard church."

Mr. Wuggazer was presented with an album of letters and telegrams from city officials, members of his congregation, Birmingham pastors and many out-of-town churches.

Later gifts will include the complete recording of the program with a photo album of the evening's activities.

Begin Biggest Program In Junior Achievement

More than two hundred Birmingham teen-agers opened the doors of their own business concerns this week as Junior Achievement began its biggest program year in Southeastern Michigan, with 271 miniature corporations founded by teen-agers.

Junior and seniors from Birmingham High school, and from Madison High in Royal Oak, are operating eight JA firms at the local business center; the organization maintains at 177 So. Woodlawn the Birmingham Theater building.

Each of the JA firms is sponsored by an established business concern, with executives from those concerns working with and advising the Achievers in problems of management, production and sales.

All of the JA firms will manufacture products, or sell services, and they will be financed through the sale of stock at fifty cents a share.

Four Get Awards at Cranbrook

CRANBROOK — The awarding of four memorial scholarships to outstanding students at Cranbrook School has been announced by Headmaster Harry D. Hoey.

The scholarship recipients, all seniors, were chosen on the basis of their high academic work and citizenship as school leaders.

BRUCE RICHARDS of Farmington was awarded the Clay Doss scholarship, donated by Mr. and Mrs. H. C. Doss of Detroit in memory of their son who was killed

shortly after his graduation from Cranbrook in 1948.

William Davis of Boiling received the Herbert R. Buckner scholarship funds for the awarding of the award to the son of the late Herbert R. Buckner, a resident of Pontiac before his death in 1954.

George R. Gary of Pontiac was named to receive the Dawson Beatty Brown memorial award, donated by the Basil Browns of Pontiac

in memory of their son who graduated from Cranbrook in 1943 and was later killed in World War II during the Battle of the Bulge.

KENNETH P. WALZ of St. Clair Shores was given the James L. McLaughlin scholarship. This award was established at Cranbrook by the John L. McLaughlins of Great Falls, Montana, in memory of their son who died a year after his Cranbrook graduation in 1948.
