OCTOBER OBITER DICTA

1. Plant TULIPS, DAFFODILS, LILIES, HEMERO (ALLIS, et cetera or we will have them coming out of our ears. (And then we couldn't hear complaints.)

2. Dig-don't pull-dahlias. Store in dry cellar-up side down. If stored in furnace cellar pack them in PEAT MOSS or VERMICULITE and keep a moist EC-CENTRIC or other newspaper over them.

3. Dry gladiolus corms in sun, discard unhealthy ones and dust remainder with NEUDUST. Store in shallow boxes or open mesh bags.

4. Dig up caladiums—remove tops—dry in sun-ace in dry sand or peat moss at 60 degrees or over.

Divide clumps of anchusa, lily-of-the-valley, phlox, veronica, gypsophila, etc., and replant. Got specific in-structions on dividing peony roots.

6. Plant PRONY ROOTS now

7. A wonderful time for planting lilac bushes.

8. Water all trees and shrubs once a week with one inch of water until the ground freezes. 9. A good fertilizer for small trees, shrubs and flower garden at this time is BONE MEAL. 4 to 5 lbs. per 100

10. Vermiculite is an excellent material for storing bulbs and comms in.

11. Dig as many parsnips—ugh—and oyster plants—gh. ugh—as you may need for early use. The rest will seep perfectly in the ground until Spring.

12. Squashes and pumpkins should be stored at 50 degrees—beets, carrots and onlons at 33 to 40 degrees. 13. Divide old rhubarb plants into 4 pieces and plant

14. Gather leaves, grass clippings and garden debris and pile with ACTIVO in layers.

15. Mow the lawn right up until the end of the growing season to prevent matting.

16. Remove all leaves from lawn. If you have a small car you can trade it in on a PARKER-SPRINGFIELD SWEFPER (for a Cadillac we can get you a sweeper with a motor—about 60 miles per gallon).
