BITS OF BIRMINGHAM

BIRMINGHAM high school's year book, "The Piper" took a first place of schools of its size, 1,501-2,500 enrollment, in the offset printing division of the Columbia Scholastic Press association's annual competition. The New York group listed 27 Michigan schools among the winners. Judging is based on size and type of school, method of production and quality of the book.

DON HOFF, NEW FOOTBALL COACH at Bloomfield Hills, probably has no objections to pep rallies. First student assembly in the brand new gymnasium of Bloomfield Hills high school featured a pep rally and a modeling of football equipment last Friday afternoon.
