**Rites Saturday For Mrs. Hill**

Mrs. Perry C. Hill, who was active for many years in civic and church affairs of Detroit and Birmingham, died Tuesday in a hospital in Madison, Wis., at the age of 74. Her home in Birmingham was at 252 West Brown street. A memorial service will be held in St. James church, Birmingham, at 1:30 p.m., Saturday, Oct. 22. Interment will be at Newport. Mrs. Hill was an incorporator and charter member of the Women's City Club of Detroit in 1919 and was an officer and board member. She was one of the Episcopal churchwomen who established Williams House in Detroit in 1921, a home for friendless girls operated by the diocese of Michigan and served for many years on its board.

**DURING** World War I she was active in the National League for Women's Service and was a member and served on the board of the Detroit Citizens League. In 1947 she was appointed to the governor's commission on reorganization of government for the state of Michigan. She served on the executive board of Kingswood school for girls, Cranbrook Foundation, Bloomfield Hills. She was a one-time officer and board member of the Detroit YWCA, and was long active in the Michigan League of Women Voters, and until last spring was a member of the board of the Oakland County Planned Parenthood Assoc.

Mrs. Hill was a communicant of St. Paul's Episcopal cathedral in Detroit, and later of St. James' church, Birmingham. In former years she was active in the organization of diocesan churchwomen. In Birmingham she was a member of the Friends of the Baldwin Public Library.

SHE was a native of Newport, R. I., a 1901 graduate of Bryn Mawr college, M.A. 1907, and a teacher at Ipswich, Mass. Her first husband at Greenwich, Conn., before the marriage in 1908.

Surviving are a daughter, Mrs. Vernon Carstensen of Madison, Wis., with whom she had lived in recent months; another daughter, Mrs. Gilman Ostrander of Dublin, O.; a son, Perry C. Hill of Milwaukee; a sister, two brothers and seven grandchildren.
