

'The Imposter' To Be Shown At Cranbrook

CRANBROOK — "The Imposter," to be shown Nov. 1 by the Foreign Film Club at Cranbrook Institute of Science, is the fourth Japanese film since World War II to be exhibited in the United States with English titles.

It is open to the public. No tickets are sold but contributions are accepted to help defray expenses. "The Imposter" is a part-historical, part-fictional drama of adventure, love and intrigue, featuring Japanese sword play, which is idealized in the orient much in the manner of our own Western gun-fighter. It is a story of a baron, a warrior who is still living in an era of peace with no wars to add to his glory.

Royal Oaker Heads Toastmasters Club

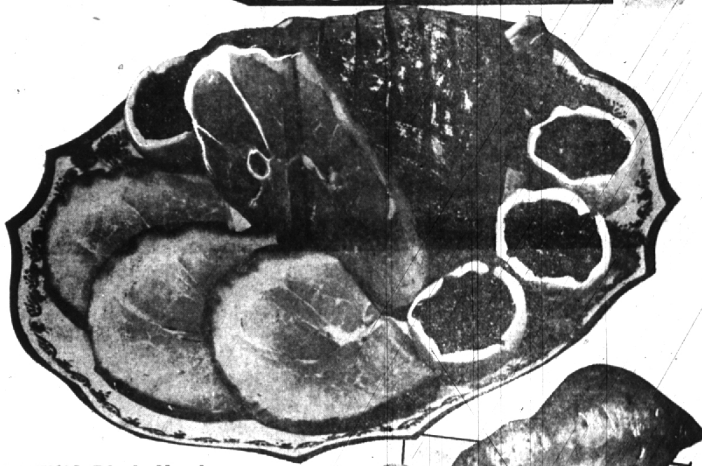
