Services Tuesday For Dr. Tolle, Laboratory Head

Director of the Clinical Laboratory at St. Joseph Mercy hospital, Dr. Charles B. Tolle, M.D., died unexpectedly at his home Saturday. His home is at 927 Covington road, Bloomfield Village.

Dr. Tolle, whose offices were in the Riker building, Pontiac, was graduated from the University of Michigan Medical School in 1942. He was secretary-treasurer of the Oakland County Medical Society and a member of the Michigan State Medical Society and the American Medical Association.

Born Nov. 8, 1917, in Dallas, Texas, he married Chasene Valley on June 15, 1938. A veteran of World War II, he was a navy lieutenant. He was a member of the First Presbyterian church.

Funeral services will be conducted at 11 a.m. Saturday at the Bell chapel of the Wm. R. Hamilton Co. The Rev. Gray B. Berkeley of St. Columba's Episcopal church will officiate. Burial will be in Evergreen cemetery.
