Guest Artist Gives Program Of Organ Music

Viola Klais, well-known organist of Philadelphia and Palm Beach, will be guest artist for the Birmingham Hammond Organ Society at 8 p.m., Nov. 2, at Grinnell.

Due to her knowledge of the organ, orchestration and registration, Miss Klais is considered an expert on the Hammond. Her programs are extensive—from heavy organ music to lighter classics, current show numbers and popular tunes. Her interpretations are strictly orchestral.

From 1945 to 1948 Miss Klais toured the United States entertaining at Veterans' hospitals and cover was entertained for the Armed forces in such places as Paris, Rome, Florence, Naples and Isle of Capri.

Her program here will include Adoration by Borowski, (sung by priests), Beethoven's "Sonata in Summer by Chopin and Toccata and Fugue" (Major by Bach). Orchestral presentations will include Sigmund Romberg's Melodrama from "Student Prince", Debussy's Clair Delune, Noyon's Narcissus and Ballet of Flowers by Tchaikovsky.

Others are I Dreamed I Dwelt on Maple Hill from "Bohemian Girl", Halls, A and B—especially arranged by Viola Klais, Waters of Minnetonka, Syncope Clock and Melodias from South Pacific.

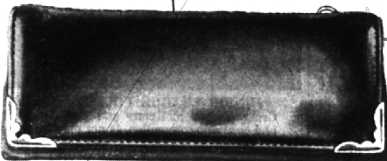
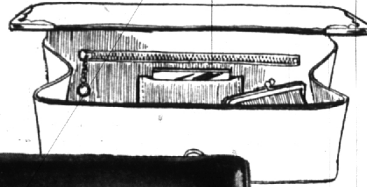
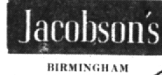
