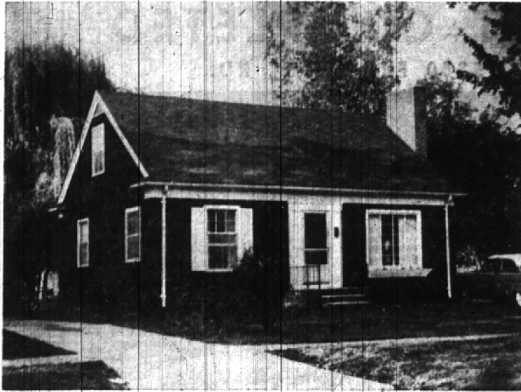
Mrs. Ray Sifferman and Mrs. Howard Lambie, chairmen of the guilds, were pleased with the ticket

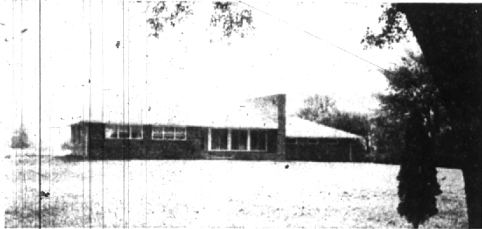

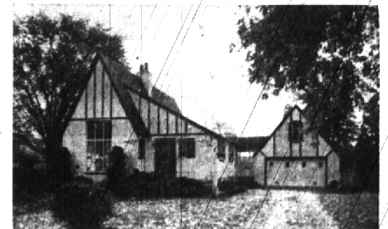

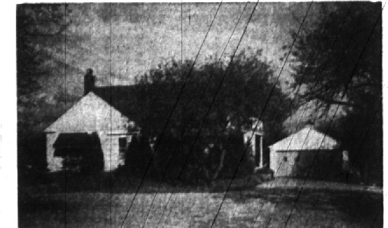
