Only three times since 1942 when he started Moose hunting in Canada has Becker failed to supply the main dish of the menu for the church.

Last week Becker and three friends returned from their 10 day trip, which carried them more than 200 miles into Ontario, each with a prize Moose totaling more than 1800 pounds of meat.

This is the fifth straight dinner for the church in as many years. The three year Becker failed to take a Moose was when he exchanged his hunting grounds from Ontario to Montreal. Now he goes annually to Ontario and plans to keep this part of Canada his hunting headquarters every October.

"Too many Eastern hunters go into Montreal," says Becker, "and the Moose are more abundant in Ontario."
