

Asks Application Of Rotary Ideals

How the ideals of Rotary can benefit the member and his community were stressed by an international director at a one-day institute here last week.

He was Kenneth Partridge of Port Credit, Ont., who spoke to more than 150 Rotarians from host club Birmingham and delegates from other district clubs. He was introduced by George B. Hartwick, Rotary district governor from Pontiac.

"You can do much for your business, office and for your community by carrying back to it the ideals of Rotary," Partridge said.

"We certainly have to meet the problems on our own block before we are qualified to handle the world's problems," he concluded.

Recalls Peace In Solomon's Time

In your Sept. 29, 1955, paper I read your account of Isaac J. Pitman's speech he gave at the Community House, Friday Sept. 28. You mention Henry Foley and Henry S. Booth asking questions but nothing about the questions asked that almost raised the audience to their feet.

One listener asked, "Did this audience know there was the most successful League of Nations 2,000 years ago? If so raise your hand." No hands went up.

He then told them it was under King Solomon, there was no arsenal, no round of ammunition in the United Nations, Solomon had 40 years reign without war. His father had so much war and bloodshed during his 40 years, God told him he would not use him to build the Great Temple.

Solomon's great success in making his life of Nations workable was in marrying the daughter of every King of the then World he married 700 women. Every King refused to start a war on Solomon because he treated them all as fathers-in-law and they all said "that's my son-in-law."

HIS SON, Rehoboam, took over. He had war again with all the Kings again engaged in battle. There was so much war and bloodshed Israel lost their country, their Temple. Their Jerusalem was burned to ashes.

Soon after this a Greek philosopher said "If God wants people to live at peace with each other on this earth, He will have to come down to earth and show them how to do it."

That very thing happened. He came to earth for 33 years and taught man how to live at peace with each other.

What impresses me most was, He said, "They that take the sword shall perish with the sword."

The speaker needs not to be reminded that at one time the sun shone on the British empire 24 hours a day. It is high time to remind him that to save the remainder of their empire, he should advise the world not to invite an arsenal into the United Nations, as did the speaker here tonight.

Praises Telephone, Police Department For Fast Service

A recent accident at my home brought forth fast and efficient help by a mechanic I did not know existed. I believe it would be helpful and comforting to many of your readers to hear of my experience.

On Sunday, September 18, Mrs. Kass and I drove our son to Ann Arbor to enter the University of Michigan. During our absence, my father fell in the kitchen and broke his hip. In falling he pulled the phone receiver from its cradle. This produced a signal on the switchboard which in a short time caused the operator, Number 127, to notify the Police Department of a possible emergency.

ACCORDING TO our neighbors, two squad cars appeared. The first car was manned by Officers Buckley and Davis, who entered the house, appraised the situation and radioed for an ambulance which responded very quickly. In the meantime the two officers made my father comfortable and gave him the kind of assurance so appreciated by elderly folk.

After the ambulance departed for the hospital these two officers requested two of our neighbors to come into the house. In company, they made the house secure by

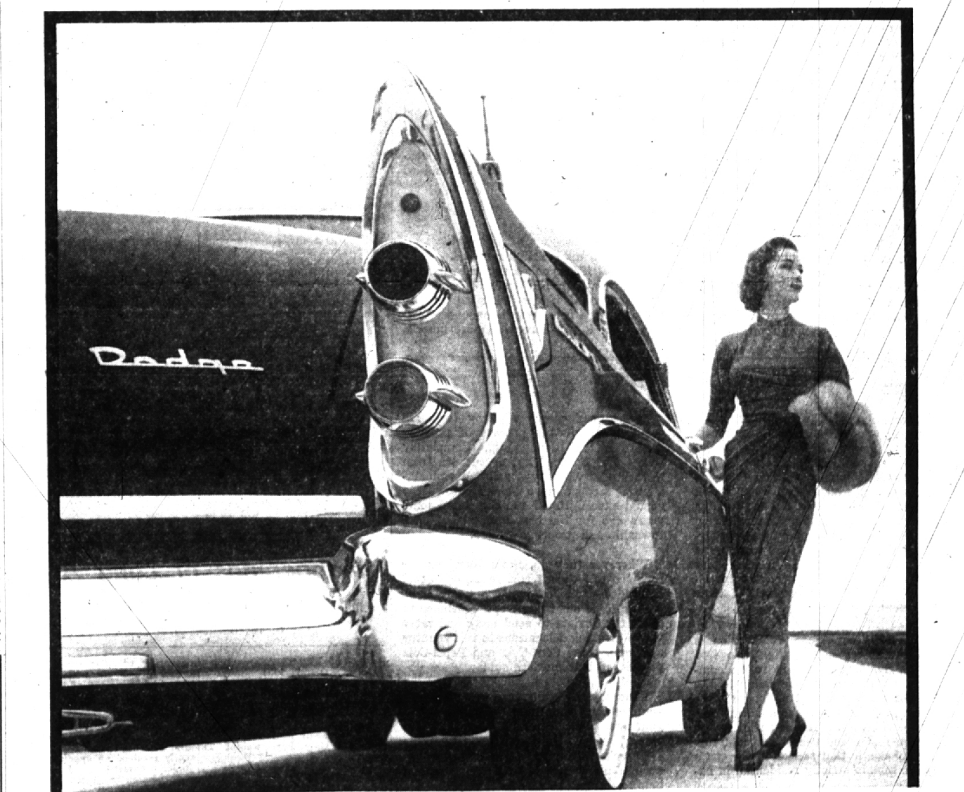
