Morris is connected with Chrysler corporation, in which he is chief engineer of the marine and industrial division in the Trenton plant.

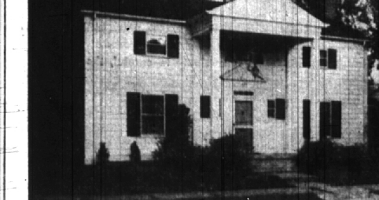
