**Community House
Already Planning
1956 Roll Call**

Reports and election of officers featured the annual dinner meeting of the Community House Monday evening.

Harold Hagan, president, and Mrs. Effie Schaffer, stressed that reports were seemingly low because only a six-months period is included at this time. The House fiscal year was altered some time ago to end Aug. 31 rather than February which conflicts with annual Roll Call dates.

Replacements on the board include Mrs. Raymond Peck, filling the term of Mrs. Robert Pease, and William Torrence for Russell Robinson.

Others are Mrs. Richard Brown, Mrs. Earl Kuehl, Mrs. Walter Jackson, Norman Weston and Ed Kurth. Officers for the coming year include Hagan, again serving as president; Mrs. Charles Kass and William Leveche, vice presidents; Norman Weston, treasurer; Mrs. Harry Gruber and Mrs. Walter Jackson, recording and corresponding secretaries.



A LONG AWAITED dream begins to come true at Franklin as earth removing machines start to dig at the site of the new Franklin Community church on the Village Green. The groundbreaking ceremonies Easter Sunday, marked the first formal step toward the new building, funerals for which had been collected in a community-wide solicitation.

IN SPITE of the "short" year and the vacation period of four weeks, nearly 27,000 persons have used the House.

Mrs. Schaffer's report included full activities, such as organization meetings there, regularly; groups which used the House for special events; sickroom cupboard and employment agency.

The latter shows that approximately 50 per cent of the persons registering there are placed in local employment, mainly house-holds.

She mentioned young peoples activities and the two Senior groups, the Monday evening social group and the Workshop sponsored by Birmingham Junior League.

"This group," she commented, "is growing so rapidly that the League is now facing a transportation problem getting them to and from the meetings."

HAGAN MADE reference to the completely redone kitchen which still lacks a few details such as proper lights.

"The work there," he said, "took quite a sum of money, but is well worth every cent. It is partially soundproofed, improving conditions for meetings. Its arrangement and new equipment was carefully plan-

ned to better working conditions and make for greater speed.

"Another heavy expense and an unexpected one, came when the building inspector condemned the ceiling of the Mary Griffith lounge. The work has been finished now and the room is in use.

"Other improvements have been made in the craft room, moving that division into larger, more pleasant quarters.

"ALL IN ALL, I think the House is closing a successful year. Those working here are to be congratulated on the excellence of their job and the spirit of their cooperation."

Hagan announced that Mrs. George A. Weinhold had been named to head the 1956 Roll Call.

"She said preliminary work was being done to review past drives and have the coming campaign on these findings.

"We know certain phases have been successful, others have not. What we want to do is to bypass the ones that were not."
