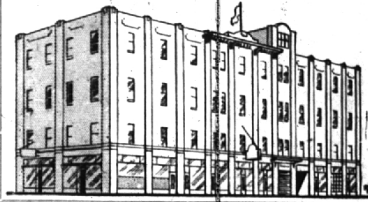
Mrs. Sherman wore black lace over flesh-colored taffeta with pink accessories. Her orchids were white.

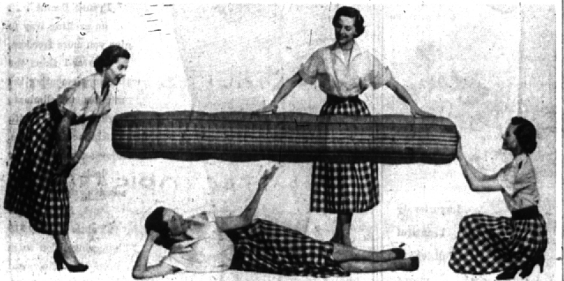
