Over 26,000 flag codes also were distributed.

IN ADDITION to these and work with the national defense officials and Red Cross, the DAR works closely with schools.

This is, perhaps, the largest project, with its scholarships, school benefits and actual maintenance of entire schools.

Two schools are supported by the DAR with 11 others on the "approved" list. During the past four years nearly \$2 million have been spent on these programs.

Last year \$17,000 was raised for scholarships for American Indians. Nursing scholarships were awarded to six Negro girls along with other citizen awards distributed through high schools in all areas.

SCHOLARSHIP prizes are awarded to service academies including army, navy, coast guard, merchant marine, marine corps and air force.

Never has it been more essential than now to stress the necessity of cherishing the freedoms we have inherited under our constitutional government, a DAR spokesman declared at the state convention.

"The place to begin preserving the American Way is on the hometown level. If our communities are clear, clean, strong and patriotic, improvement will inevitably come for our individual states and the nation," she concluded.
