The adult evening courses listed below will be offered for a period of ten weeks beginning the week of October 3.

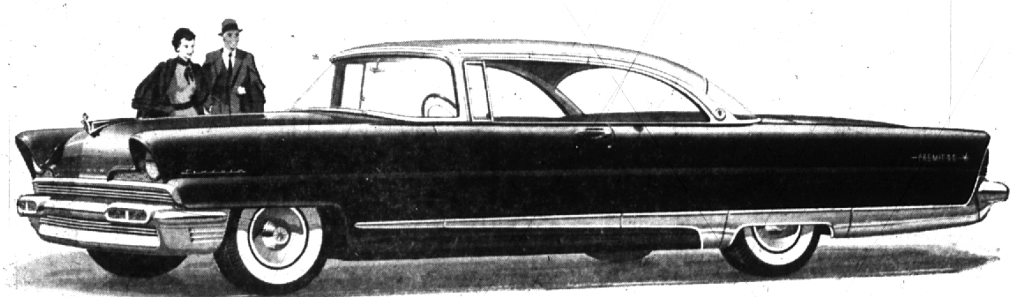
- a. All classes will be held at the Birmingham High School.

- BASIC ECONOMICS**  
Instructors from Henry George School of Social Science—No Fee, Tuesdays.
  - CAKE DECORATION**  
Instruction in the making of flowers, scrolls, etc. Designs for the professional looking cake. Fee—\$6.00, Thursday.
  - CONVERSATIONAL FRENCH**
