SOUTHFIELD—So that residents here may learn quickly what will be contained in the charter...

CHAPTER I—NAME AND BOUNDARIES: Chapter one concerns itself mainly with these boundaries...

CHAPTER II—MUNICIPAL POWERS AND AUTHORITY: The second chapter also gives the city usual powers over land, both private and public...

CHAPTER III—REGISTRATION, NOMINATION ELECTION:

Registration, nomination and election are detailed in Chapter Three, which provides a one-way system and allows the city council to establish voting or election precincts...

CANDIDATES shall file petitions, with 200 (minimum) to 300 (maximum) signatures of qualified and registered electors...

REGULAR election shall be the first Monday in April. Election Commission shall appoint Board of Election Inspectors...

IN CASE of a tie vote, the right to be nominated or elected shall be decided by lot, after a recount of votes is held.

CHAPTER IV—GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION: Seven members shall compose the city council. At the first regular election...

MAYOR shall be the city's executive head with a voice and vote in council proceedings, equal with other members...

CHIEF administrative officer, the city manager shall be responsible to council for all administrative departments...
