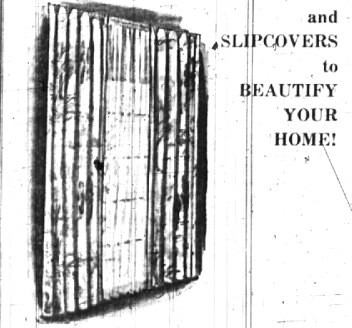

## St. Columban Launches Drive for \$100,000

A capital building fund campaign for \$100,000 was announced this week to parishioners of St. Columban church, 2290 Dunstable, Birmingham, by the Rev. Thomas M. Kenny, pastor. Father Kenny indicated the funds will be used to help reduce the debt on present parish properties, and once the debt is substantially reduced, construction on a new eight classroom school will be undertaken.

## Claims Damages For Broken Jaw

Suits for \$26,500 in damages against the city of Birmingham and Mr. and Mrs. Raymond F. Nixon, 1990 Lone Pine, Bloomfield township, were filed this week in Oakland county circuit court on behalf of a nine-year-old boy. He is Neil H. Harrison, 9, son of Mr. and Mrs. Edward E. Harrison, 1124 Chapin.

According to the complaint, Neil suffered a broken jaw when on his way home from school in October, 1952, he slipped playfully into a pile of leaves and hit his face on a stone hidden beneath which the suit claims was well within the public right-of-way.

The accident happened when the Nixons lived on Baldwin street, Birmingham.

## Survey on Water, Sewer Problems

A five-county study of sewer and water problems in the Detroit area was proposed this week by the executive committee of the Detroit metropolitan area regional planning commission.

It was recommended that a new committee draw plans for a coordinated study in Oakland, Wayne, Washtenaw, Macomb and Monroe counties.

A similar, 2 1/2-year, \$750,000 study recently was completed of the origin and destination of area traffic.

South Oakland communities may be strongly interested in such a plan, for in the past 2 to 8 years, most of them have been or are being involved on a local area basis in mutual sewer and water authorities.

(Continued from Page 1, Sec. 1.) paralleling US-10 and "still have three times that amount left for other state roads."

Higgins, however, quoted from a 1954 state highway report which said only "some small areas have been made on this tremendous backlog of work."

Higgins called upon Ziegler to decide soon whether he was going to cooperate with the MTA (of which he is a member) and let the turnpike be built with bond money and put the highway funds into projects elsewhere in the state.

ZIEGLER said he didn't care who builds the turnpike.

"But we already have so much money already invested in portions of the freeway that we can't just forget it," the commissioner commented.

At an MTA meeting earlier Monday, Murray D. Van Wagener of Birmingham, former highway commissioner and Democratic gubernatorial candidate, was hired at \$1,000 a month as an engineering consultant.

Former state auditor Mart Aton of Jackson was hired at \$833 a month as MTA secretary-treasurer.

Higgins also said the pike would be shifted to the west side of Dearborn because it would require acquisition and removal of many more homes than the present initial route would take.

IN 1954 Miles wrote from Rome "I am working as a slave or a horse, having enormous work all ways over me... which in the same time is my happiness... I am going to make few things for Europe as far USA but I start to be a bit tired now. I cannot run as fast before ladders, moving up and down."

Among the "endless work" he was doing in Rome was the Macaulay Memorial for the Detroit Civic Center—"The Spirit of Transportation" for which the site will be chosen by Eric Saarinen, whose father Elio Saarinen was the first president of Cranbrook Academy of Art, and who invited Miles to sculpt in 1929.
