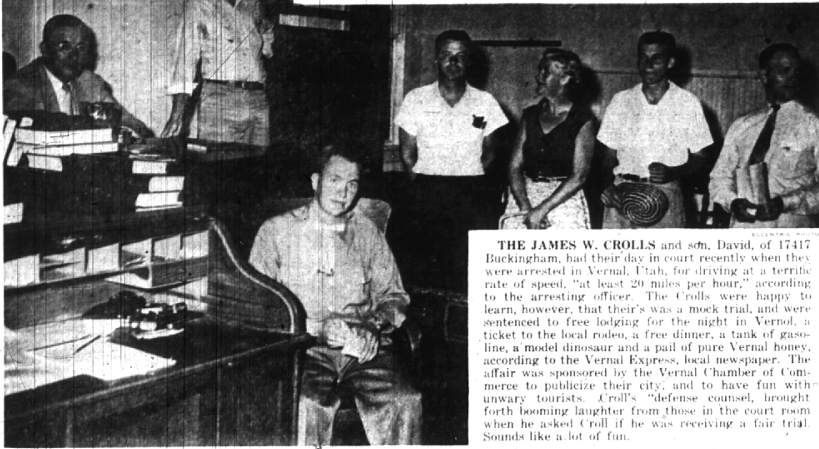
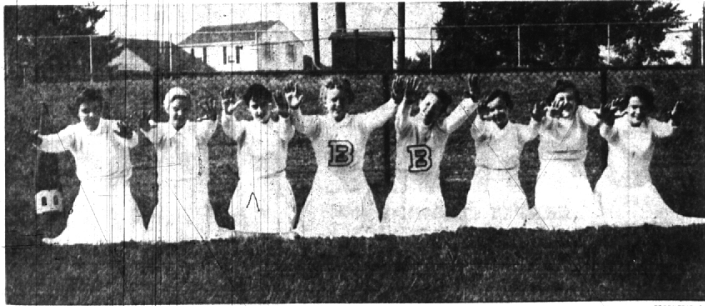

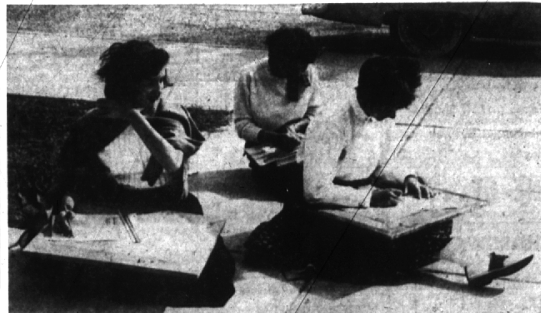
Franklin Family Visits Powerama

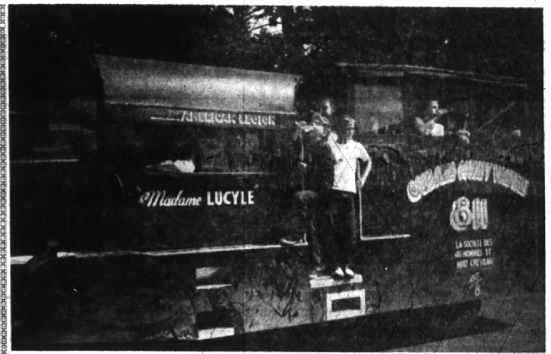
Children Aid Red Cross
