Plans for the coming year will be made and each troop will start meetings the first week in October.

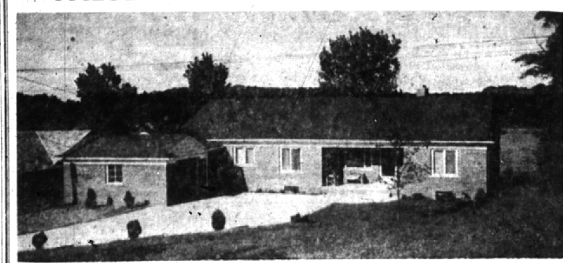

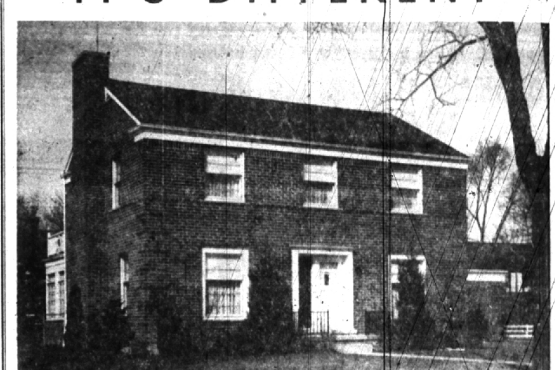

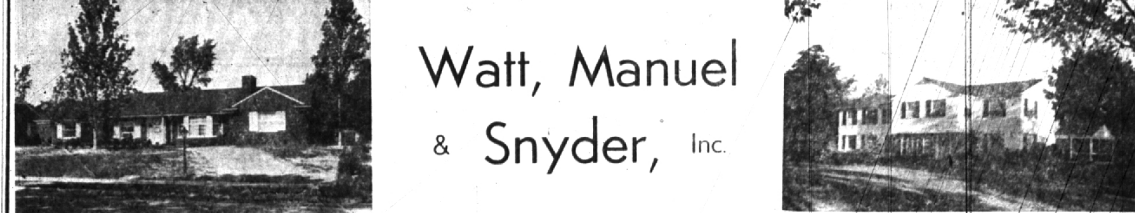
