Garden Members At Conservation Meet at Higgins

Mrs. Charles Davison, conservation chairman for the Birmingham branch of Woman's National Farm and Garden association, and Mrs. W. L. Lawrie attended the conservation conference at Higgins Lake last week.

"Water" was the theme of the conference and program was offered by Norman Billings, Miss Helen Martin, O. H. Clark and Paul Barrett.

Mr. Clark described what the State of Michigan was doing to help farmers save their forest and prevent stream pollution with silt. He also described methods used for the protection of streams so they are safe for game and wildlife. Miss Helen Martin, a research geologist, used the title, "Water, how did we get so much?" A demonstration was also given on ground water, how to sink a well for fire fighting, thus obtaining water quickly. Paul Barrett summarized the entire conference.

The conference is an annual affair open to all garden club and Izaak members. "More women should plan to attend every year, for it is a lot of fun along with a worthwhile and educational program," said Mrs. Davison in commenting on her experience.
