The family will spend a few days at its summer home on Glen Lake before Gerry returns to tenth grade classes at the Academy of the Sacred Heart in Detroit.



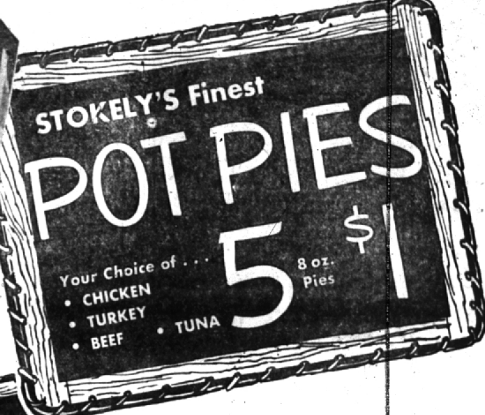
