### LET'S GET SERIOUS

GRASS: Any of various plants that cover fields, lawns and pastures and are eaten by horses, cows and sheep . . . . Thorndike & Barnhart.

Your grass is probably the most important asset your house has. You spend a lot of dough on it but are you getting your dough's worth out of it? We feel that with almost any good material you can have a faine lawn—and—you can have a faine lawn—in the state of the s

Let's face the facts. An abundance of weeds in an established turf is an indication that something is wrong with the soil or the maintenance practices.

Permanent eradication of weeds entails not only their emoval by hand and chemical herbicides but also the adoption of a definite maintenance program to build up a turl that will withstand future invasion of weeds.

Let us ask you a few questions regarding what you should have done this semester. (If you have a beautiful lawn get a good book and go die down in the hammork.)

- 1. Did you dig out or spray the weeds that appeared in May, June and July?
- 2. Did you use a PRE-EMERGENCE crabgrass killer in May?
- 3. Did you dig out, clip off or spray the crabgrass plants as they appeared in June, July and August?
- 1. Did you use 1 lb. of seed for 400 sq. ft. in your Spring re-seeding?
- 5. Did you raise your mower to a MINIMUM OF TWO INCHES on the first of June?
- 6. Did you water once a week so as to put ONE INCH of water on the ground? ( $^{1}$ <sub>1</sub> to  $^{1}$ <sub>2</sub> inch twice a week is no good, lousy, disastrous.)
- 7. Did you use a lot of temporary grass such as perennial rye or red top?
- 8. Did you take a good, well-designed lawn mixture and dilute it with a less expensive temporary grass to hold the cost down? (Poor economy.)
- Did you get frantic in July and August when the grass turned brown and try to water the whole lawn every other day?
- 10. Did you use 2 lbs, per 100 sq. ft. of 10-6-1 fer-tilizer in the Spring? Did you put on at least two appli-cations of 10-6-1 at 1 lb, to 100 sq. ft. or 2 lbs. of organic fertilizer during the Summer months?
- 11. Did you hate us and blame your yardman and envy your lucky neighbor?

Your neighbor wasn't lucky. He knew you couldn't get something for nothing. He had a lot of money tied up in his lawn and meant to protect that investment with a carefully planned maintenance program.

Now for a few statements of fact. Take your pick in accordance with your situation.

- Some weeds, such as raigweed, witch grass, fox-tails and mustard and even quack grass will disappear after two or three mowings.
- Kentucky Blue Grass makes the prettiest and most durable lawn in this latitude. (Some like bent but the cost of maintenance is considerably higher.)
- Lawn seed for Fall should have not more than 20 per cent temporary seed.
- It should be sown, if possible, before September 30—earlier if possible.
  - 5. It should be sown at the rate of:-
    - I lb. to 200 sq. ft. of bare ground I lb. to 300 sq. ft. of thin lawn I lb. to 400 sq. ft. of good lawn
- 6. Seed should be sown AFTER the fertilizer is spread and watered in.
- 7. Fertilizer should be 10-6-1 and spread at 2 lbs. Jo 100 sq. ft. and washed off grass blades immediately after spreading.
- 8. Water every day or two on new seedings or if the rains do not come.
- 9. Mow 2 inches high until late in September—then  $1^{1}\imath$  inches is OK.
- 10. You can't have something for nothing. If you can't do it ALL correctly—do a small part now and the rest when you can.
