

Sees 2 Main Benefits Resulting from New Judgeship

Oakland County's newest circuit judge who will take office at the start of the new year, Clark J. Adams, feels his receipt of appointment to the bench will assure Oakland residents that our courts are fulfilling their responsibilities in the framework of our county government.
This will be achieved, Adams told The Birmingham Eccentric

this week, primarily by reducing long waiting periods for trial, and by trying cases while witnesses' memories are still fresh.
He continued:

THE RECENT growth in the population of Oakland County has brought about a critical need for judicial services. Twenty-eight years ago it was thought that a county population of some two hundred thousand people required three circuit judges. Today with a population of over five hundred people we continue to operate our Circuit Court with only three judges. As a consequence, the trial of our cases has been unreasonably delayed.

"To meet this emergency the county Legislature created a fourth circuit judge to take office on January 1, 1956, and it is hoped that with this addition, the courts can keep abreast of current litigation and at the same time dispense of an heavy back log of pending cases.

"The present circuit judges have a record for having taken more of our new law suits each year than any other judges in the state. Still they have gradually allowed a backlog to build up because of the current increase of cases started, an increase seven times greater than

the average increase in the state.
"BY WAY of example, in the year 1953 each of the three circuit judges tried almost 700 cases and yet the backlog of unduly cases increased by nearly 400 during that same year.
This year the person who starts a suit must expect to wait almost a year before it can be tried. At the beginning of the year there were nearly 1,000 cases awaiting trial. Such delays are costly to litigants and subject the courts to undeserved criticism.
Obviously one additional judge will not correct the situation overnight. Oakland county continues to grow at a rapid pace. Those in a position to estimate with reasonable accuracy estimate that our population will increase to 600,000 in the next five years. That means more work for the courts.

COURTS HANDLE problems in human relations and the exact mathematical formulae can be used to forecast the future, but in spite of the accumulated number of unduly cases and the probable increase in the backlog, the trial court will bring about a healthy improvement in the administration of justice.

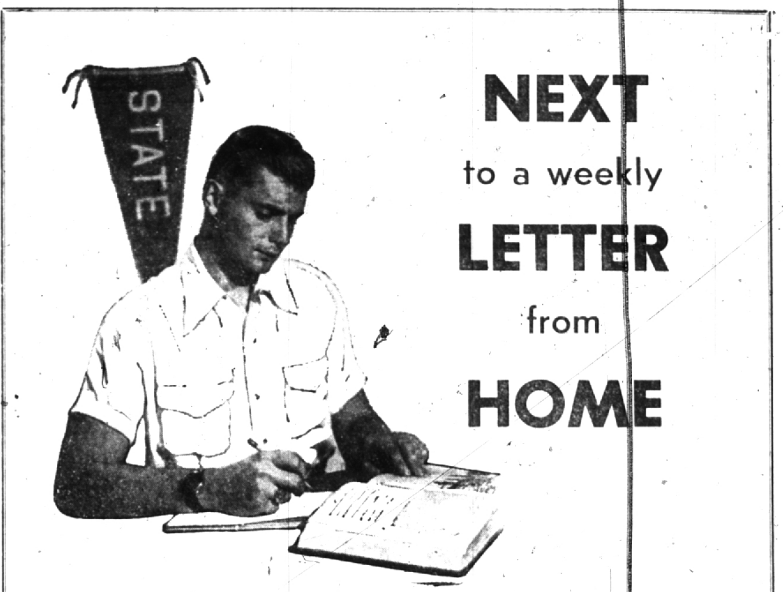
