Wing Lake Artist's Work Displayed at Vancouver

Start Road Winterizing Program

College Set Leaving Soon

SOUTHFIELD — Work on winterizing the township's roads began this week after a survey last Thursday by the township supervisor Eugene Swem, disclosed that five roads are in need of immediate attention.

Those five are Pierce, Beverly, Bid, Evergreen, and part of 14 Mile road. Scraping of Pierce kicked off the project that will continue until the winter freeze arrives.

Wednesday night the township trustees, in a special meeting, voted to transfer \$5,000 from the general fund to help carry the project until money comes in from other sources.

The program calls for complete winterization, which includes scraping, leaving out ditches, opening curbs and patching holes, according to Swem. In addition all township roads will be scraped except those that have been oiled or treated and are still in good condition.

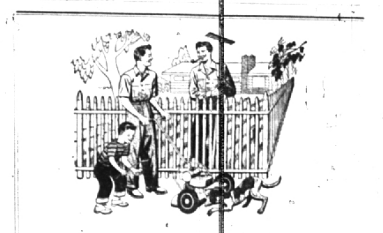
