**Add New Officer; Consider Public Safety Department**

LATHRUP—Joseph Zafarana of 27251 Santa Barbara, became the city's fourth part-time officer when he was sworn into office last week, according to Leonard Wat-chowski, city administrator.

With this announcement, Wat-chowski also revealed that a meeting on Sept 13 has been proposed by Mayor John F. Campbell to discuss the possibility of establishing a department of public safety, which would include police, fire and inspektor services.

THE PROPOSED meeting would take place between the council, the city administrator and the police department, headed by Chief K. M. Farnham, are now being daily reports, and are carrying emergency equipment, such as blankets, first aid kits and fire extinguishers, in the patrol car.

Other emergency services, including a resuscitator unit, are available to the city through Southfield fire and police departments, Wat-chowski said.

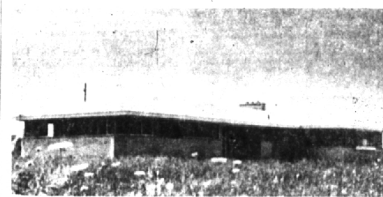

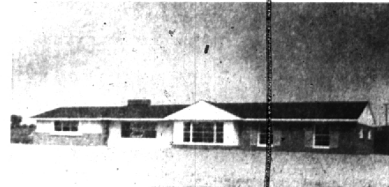
