Speed Up Zone Law Revisions

Speeding up revision of the present Birmingham zone laws was discussed last week at a joint meeting of city commission and plan board.

The city has asked planning consultant David Geer, to perform the service but Geer informed the group by letter that did not intend to start the work until late in June.

Geer estimated the job would take about three months. William H. Burgum, plan board chairman, and Herb Herzberger, city planner, were selected to meet with Geer and work out an earlier starting date.

OTHER ACTION included a discussion of Southfield road, between 14 Mile road and Lincoln. The plan board will study improving the residential character of the street by providing curbs and gutters.

Dominic Caputo's request to rezone his three lots on the east side of Pierce, immediately north of the gas station at the corner of 14 Mile road-Y was included in a general discussion of the 14 Mile road-Pierce area.

The plan board intends to provide rear access for the store frontage on the west side of Pierce, north of 14 Mile road.

No action was taken on Caputo's request to rezone his three lots from terrace to business C.

YMCA 'Fishers Of Men' Begin Fishing This Week

Special assessments involving Birmingham's share of widening 14 Mile from Cummings east to Clover Hill Park cemetery went through a necessity hearing before the city commission this week.

Royal Oak and Troy also are participating in this improvement which will widen the street two more lanes between Crooks and Greenfield roads. Construction is planned for this year.

Turnpike Authority Gets \$150,000 More

A \$150,000 extension of the Michigan turnpike authority's life was made this week by the Michigan legislature.
 Almost out of its original half million in funds, the authority is attempting to defend its 113-mile Flatrock-Saginaw toll road against attack from several communities along the proposed route (including Franklin Village and Bloomfield and Southfield townships) and the state highway department.
