Within a short time the pack was operating with weekly den meetings and monthly pack meetings. An application was submitted for a charter. This charter was presented to the representative of the sponsoring organization at the April pack meeting.

After the charter ceremony, Cubs enjoyed participating in several games. The candy scramble game brought cheers.

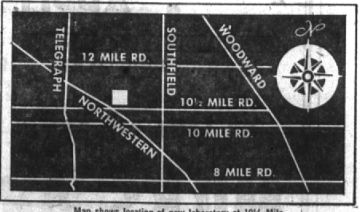
