

S'field Teachers Get \$400 Raise; Are Put on Schedule

SOUTHFIELD—Estimated additional revenue for the coming year will allow the school board to keep teachers on a salary schedule for the first time.

A lack of funds in the past has forced the board to use an operating schedule which was below the teacher's schedule. The schedule and tentative 1955-57 school budget were announced last Thursday at the school board meeting with the professional problems committee of the Southfield Education Association.

MINIMUM salary with an A-50 degree will be \$4200 which rises to a \$400 raise over last year's schedule. A \$250 state bonus to teachers raised the salary to \$4000 this year.

Annual increments in the new schedule will be \$200 for the first year and \$100 for the tenth year which makes the maximum \$6500. Teachers with a master's degree will receive \$200 over base pay.

ESTIMATED increase in the school district valuation is expected to take care of the raises and school teachers on schedule for the first time.

The school board approved a tentative budget of \$1,882,268 for submission to the county allocation board. Instructional cost is \$1,322,041 of the proposed budget compared with \$1,001,827 of the current \$1,581,427 budget.

INSTRUCTIONAL costs cover teacher's pay, teaching materials, supplies and text books. The increase is caused by the additional classrooms which must be filled by fall.

The meeting was called by the board to give the teachers a chance to put the teachers on a permanent schedule created the group's biggest grievance.

OTHER questions included raising the maximum salary, increasing the salary of teachers with a master's degree to \$500 over base pay and forming a committee to study methods of improving salary conditions.

Professional problem's committee chairman Pierce McCleod recommended the committee be made up of teachers, school board members and interested civic groups like the A.S.T.

School board chairman Fred W. Leonard doubted such a committee was really necessary in view of the constantly improving salary conditions of district teachers.

As a finale for the class, she opened one of the private dining rooms at Devon Gables last week and 20 of the 26 members enjoyed French champagne and hors d'oeuvres.

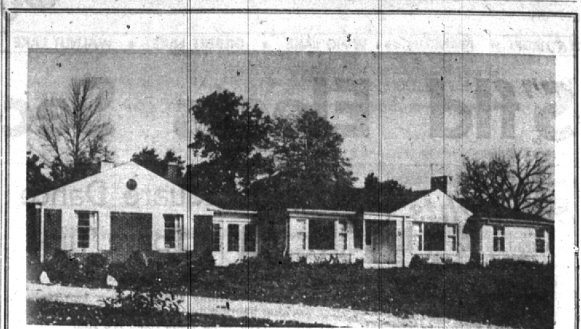
Dean LaRue, teacher, is conducting a students group on a trip to France this summer so the class gave him a handsome passport case.
