LATHRUP—A Southfield resident was admitted to William Beaumont hospital Friday after his car collided head-on with a cement transmit-mix truck on Southfield road at Margate.

James E. Kelley, 32, of 30000 Southfield, suffered loss of his left arm below the elbow, and cuts and bruises when his car swerved into the oncoming traffic lane, witnesses said. Another car, driven by Starr W. Peary, 17086 Buckingham, Southfield, was slightly damaged when Kelley's car spun around into it after the crash.

Neither Peary or the truck driver, Fred W. Erickson, 41 of Detroit, were injured, according to Lathrup Police Lt. David J. Bourgeois. Both were southbound on Southfield.

Bourgeois said no charges had been placed against Kelley, who was reported in good condition this week.
