### 3 Car Thieves Abandon Vehicles

Three automobiles stolen in Birmingham last week were found abandoned shortly afterwards, two of them in Detroit and one after a near collision.  
A spokesman reported that a youth about 17 fled from a car he had taken from Harold Turner's Sunday afternoon.  
A youth reportedly 17 got only 50 feet away from Harold Turner's stolen car on Sunday afternoon when he had a minor collision and fled from the car.  
THE PREVIOUS DAY saw the theft of a car belonging to Mrs. Zeta Garrow, of Pontiac, from the parking lot at Peabody's Market, where she is employed.  
The wrecked vehicle was found abandoned a short time later after it had crashed into the viaduct at 13 Mile and the Grand Trunk railroad in Royal Oak.  
Two Royal Oak boys said they saw approximately 17 to 20 years of age drive the car away.

ON FRIDAY NIGHT Jack Lee Cook, of Pontiac, reported his car missing from the city parking lot at Pierce and Merrill. Less than an hour after the report was received, Bloomfield township policeman Sam Shell said the stolen car nearly struck his car as he was patrolling at Broadway boulevard and Hamilton.  
Shell turned and gave chase, finding the car at the intersection abandoned and with its lights still on.

It was an exploratory conference Egbert reported in which it was agreed these two principal landowners would assist the city in undertaking municipal parking there. Meanwhile, the private parking will be maintained, he said.

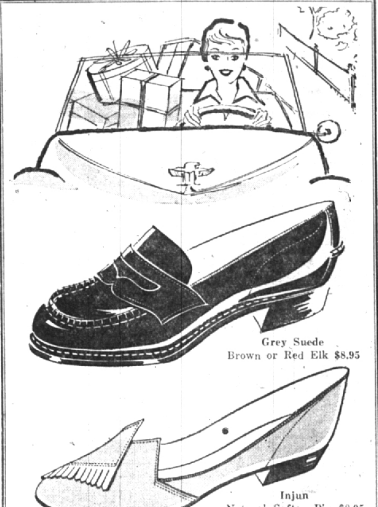

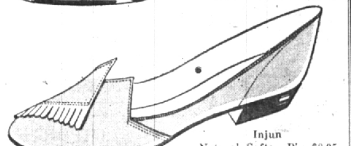

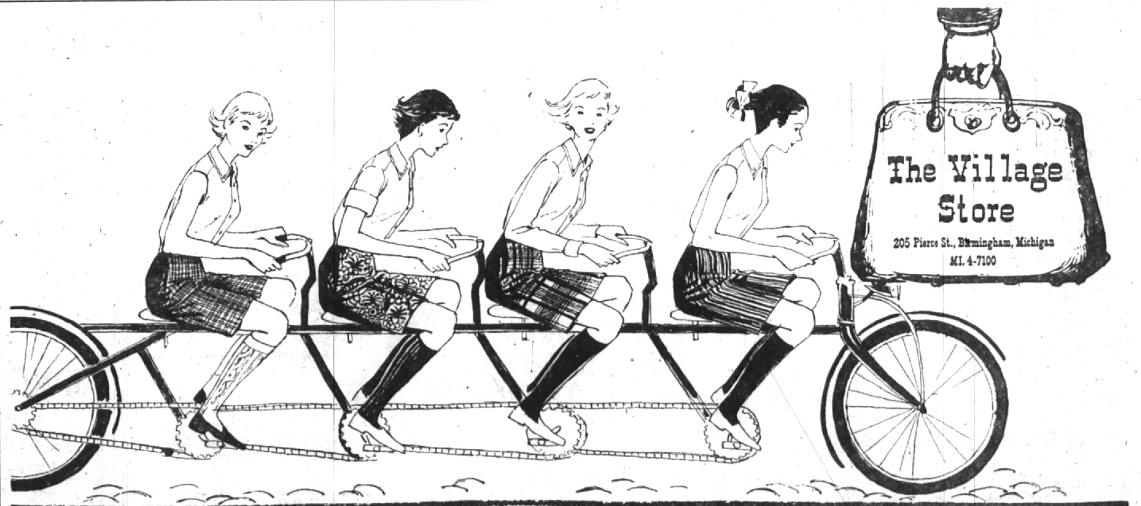
