Juvenile Court Gets Four Youths After 'Hell Week'

Because of their activities during the recent spring vacation which Birmingham Police Chief Ralph Moxley labelled "hell week", four Birmingham juveniles are being turned over to the juvenile division of Oakland county probate court by Birmingham police.

Nine other local juveniles are being released to the custody of their parents after consultation between police and the parents. An additional youth is being turned over to Bloomfield Village police in connection with hub cap thefts in that area.

Detective Robert Schaul, acting in the vacation absence of juvenile officer Lt. Henry Timm, said some of the boys were found to be involved in stealing beer, pop and hub caps. Others, he said, were involved in breaking into a home or unlawfully taking and using a car without the owner's permission.

SOME OF THE youths' actions, Schaul added, were previous to the recent vacation, and "quite a bit" of this occurred during the "hell week."
