

**Planetarium Opens Thursday Evenings For Month of May**

CRANBROOK—Cranbrook Institute of Science Director Dr. Robert T. Hart has announced that the McMath Planetarium at the Institute will be open each Thursday evening in May, with a different guest-demonstrator each week at 8 o'clock.

May 2 the demonstrator invited is Dr. Keith Pierce, associate professor of astronomy at the University of Michigan assigned to the research staff of the McMath-Hulbert observatory at Lake Arrowhead.

On May 10, Miss Ruth Hedeman, solar research assistant at the McMath-Hulbert observatory is guest-demonstrator.

Both Dr. Pierce and Miss Hedeman will demonstrate the skies of early summer, showing the configuration of the planets as well as how the sky looks to people in various parts of the earth.

American Red Cross, will travel here from as far away as Ann Arbor for Sunday's get together, and Grosse Pointe

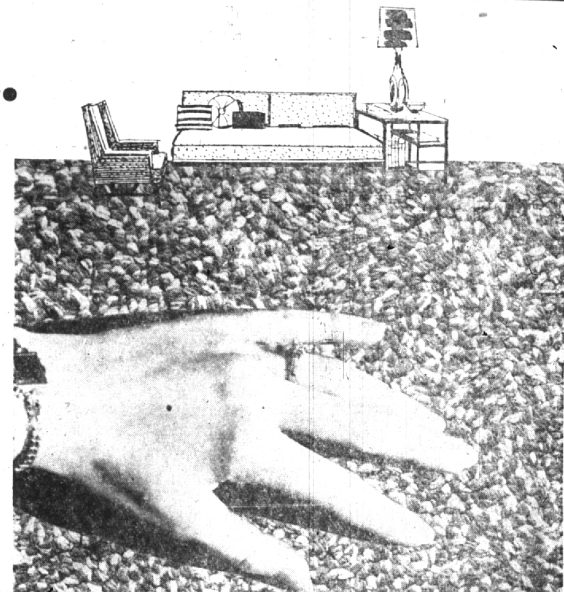

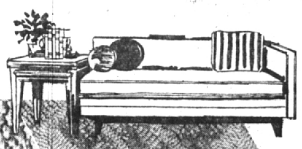

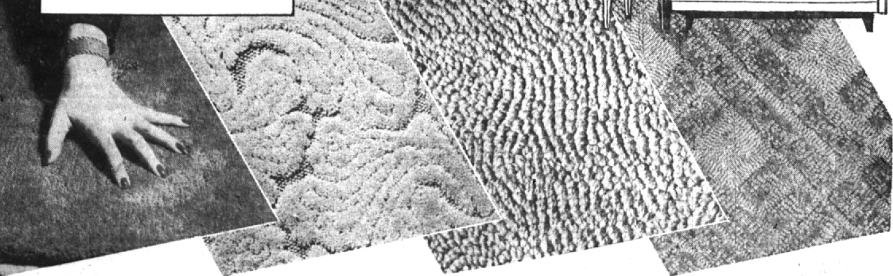
