More than a hundred Michigan Daughters of the American Revolution attended the 65th continental congress in Washington, D. C., last week.

Flatly refusing to take any stand on public school segregation, the DAR also clarified the society's stand on the United Nations. The group stated its belief in the UN as a body of sovereign nations working together for lasting peace and is against world government.

Again, this year, a resolution backed up the Brucker amendment. Their reason for this is a belief that "the constitution should have supremacy over treaty law."
