Philharmonic Organist to Play At Christ Church

CRANBROOK — An inaugural recital on the newly enlarged organ at Christ Church Cranbrook will be performed Sunday, April 29 at 8:30 p.m. by Miss Claire Coci, official organist of the New York Philharmonic symphony society.

Miss Coci has played with major symphony orchestras and given recitals from coast to coast.

The organ on which she will perform has been completely renovated, including the installation of a new pedal board, 21 new ranks of pipes and 21 new stops.

Open to the public, the Coci recital is the first program in Christ Church's spring concert series. Later this month, Dr. Maurice Garabrandt, head of music at the church, begins the annual carillon recitals which continue every Sunday afternoon until June.
