Flint scored three runs in the first inning on four Crane misplays and a wind-blown double by catcher Al Miller to insure the victory.

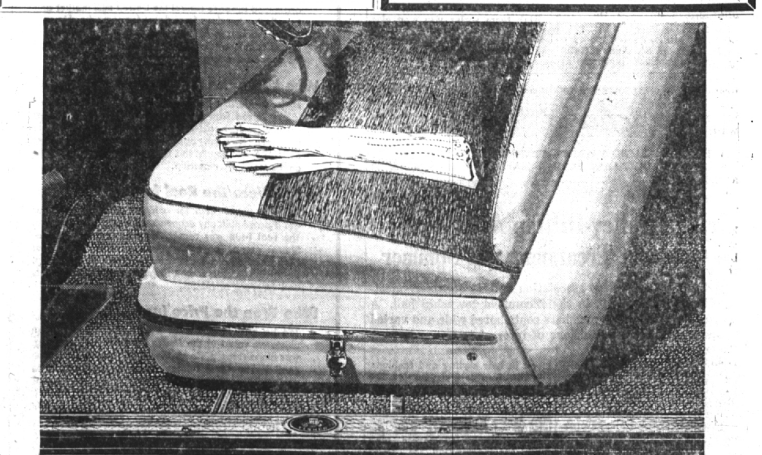
Two days earlier Cranbrook was defeated by Berkley, 5-3, in a game originally scheduled for last Tuesday but postponed until Thursday by cold weather.
