

Troy Rezoning Brings Another B'ham Objection

When Troy commissioners hear a petition April 16 for rezoning of a triangle north of Derby and east of Adams roads, they will have before them another letter from Birmingham commissioners who "are unalterably opposed" to any commercial use of the present zoned multiple family area.

At the commission's instruction, City Manager D. C. Egbert is drawing up the letter to be mailed this week.

A "problem" area for several years, sewer, water, paying and zoning problems still have not been resolved, although Troy, Birmingham and property owners each have advanced their suggestions for solutions.

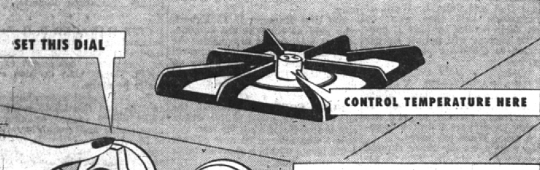

Atomic Expert Talks to Nat'l Trade Group

William C. Siler, structural engineer with Atomic Power Development Associates, Inc., Detroit, addressed the national convention of the Valve Manufacturers Assn. in Chicago April 3, discussing the progress APDA has made in the design of a 100,000 kilowatt atom-powered electric generating plant.

Siler was sent to APDA in September last year by Jackson & Moreland, a Boston engineering firm which is one of the 43 members of APDA. He is currently working on the nuclear reactor building layout.

"Absolute safety is one of the prime considerations in the reactor building design," stated Siler, 556 Merrill, Birmingham. "Nothing is being overlooked to achieve this goal both for the men who will operate the plant and for the general public."

"The TOP" brains both in government atomic laboratories and in industry are being employed by APDA to develop this fast breeder reactor, the only one of its type being designed by private industry for the production of electric power," he added.

"Actually, this type of reactor will produce more atomic fuel than it burns by converting inert non-fissionable materials into materials which can be used to produce nuclear power."

PRDC is a non-profit corporation formed by 26 companies to construct and operate the atomic power plant designed by APDA. APDA itself is also a non-profit corporation with 45 member companies financing the research and design phases of the project, Detroit Edison is a key member of both groups.

2100 Persons Attend PTA Meets On Sex Problems

Last week saw the completion of a police program to present information on sex deviates to Birmingham parents.

Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley estimated he had spoken to more than 2100 people at PTA meetings, and said every Birmingham school had been visited during the past six weeks.

Two to three hundred parents turned out at each PTA meeting to see the films "Dangerous Stranger" and "Name Unknown," Moxley said. Considerable interest in the problem was expressed, he added.

"Dangerous Stranger," warning children of the hazards in accepting friendly overtures from strangers, currently is being shown to all school children by Lt. Henry Timm, Birmingham police juvenile officer.

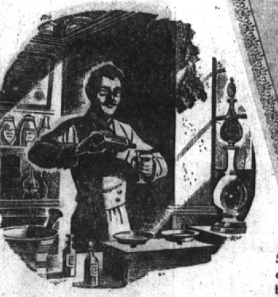
