

Homemakers Hear Talk On Guidance

"We're in business to go out of business," said Olive Viola, supervisor of Birmingham branch, Oakland Child Guidance clinic.

Speaking at the recent meeting of the Graefield Homemaking Extension unit, Miss Viola explained the clinic's ultimate goal is to change day-to-day living patterns of "problem" families, to provide a natural, lasting immunity to mental illness.

"FOR THE MOST part, the clinic treats the emotionally disturbed child," she said. "The degree of disturbance varies and is often slight.

These disturbances, however, may grow with the child and cause serious mental problems in adulthood," she pointed out.

"It's the clinic's job to check the disturbance as soon as possible. That is, to work with child and parents to first determine the cause; and then, help change the family living pattern.

THUS the disturbance will be snuffed out before it has a chance to do any serious damage."

Children are referred by Birmingham-Bloomfield-Franklin area families, physicians and schools.

The charge for treatment is nominal—based on income and size of family. The branch is supported by Birmingham Junior League.
