**Two From Local Safety Patrols To Win AAA Trip**

A vigorous 1955-56 campaign on "School Crossing Safety" by Quanton and Poppleton schools will send two Birmingham safety patrol members to Washington, D. C., May 3-6.

The patrol members will receive a four-day, all expense trip to the capital city as guests of Automobile club of Michigan.

The schools were chosen to send representatives to the 20th AAA national safety patrol rally because of the effectiveness of their overall safety program.

BIRMINGHAM DELEGATES, to be selected from safety patrol ranks in the next two weeks, will join 140 Michigan patrolers in Detroit, May 3, to enroute for Washington.

Their arrival in the Capital will set off two full days of meeting government officials and seeing famous and historic sights, climaxed by a march down Constitution Avenue with over 30,000 other patrol members from all over the United States and Canada.

After the parade, the largest held annually in Washington, they will return by train May 6.
