FROM THE APRIL AGENDA

Several birds in the swallow family are called martins. Several swallows in the martini family should put you in the mood for erecting a martin house. Since the house should be placed on a 15 foot pole it will be best if the swallows are held to a minimum while the martins erect the pole, then the house will swallow the martins, etc., etc.

As many as 50 pairs may live in one large house and each one—or one half of each one—that is—oh, heck! Every other one lays 3 to 8 eggs. AND their usefulness is indicated by their diet, 99% consisting of bees, ants, flies, true bugs, beetles, untrue bugs and other insects. The remaining 1% is not salt and pepper but other (2) animals.

When cultivating be careful of the tips of asparagus, lilies and other bulbs.

Scatter POPPY Seeds in the border or anywhere else you want poppy.

Delphinium, hollyhocks, phlox and peonies should be dusted off with DOREAX, SULPHUR or CAPTAN as soon as growth begins.

ROSES should be selected now and planted as soon as ground is ready. We have some excellent bushes now. For Frenchmen, there is the yellow SOEUR THERESE; for the piscatorially inclined try GOLDEN SALMON; pyromaniacs will enjoy the flaming BLAZE; while Disney fans should try PINOCCHIO. And last but not least Ford people can use the red CHRYSLER IMPERIAL!!

AGRICOL, GRO-SOD, TRIPLE-X, all good 10-6-4 lawn fertilizers should be applied NOW. Please don't wait until half the growing season is gone.

Follow the fertilizing with lawn seed. Despite the publicity given to Merion, Zoysia, Miracle Green, etc., they are not yet established as the most satisfactory grasses for this latitude. The best mixtures appear to be those high in Kentucky Blue Grass... a mixture of that with Red Fescue.

SOME LAWN HINTS—

1. Fertilize NOW
2. Reseed NOW (after no. 1)
3. DO NOT rake out all the nice humus from your lawn because...
 - a. It is nourishing
 - b. It prevents many weeds from germinating or growing
 - c. It retards the drying out of the soil surface
 - d. It holds moisture itself
 - e. It provides an excellent medium for starting new seeds
4. If you rake it out you will also rake out countless grass plants
5. Roll after seeding but NOT until the ground is dry. Use a light roller—not more than 1/4 inch. The two-fold purpose of rolling is to press back the plants which have been raised by thaws and to press new seeds firmly into the seed bed.

Note: If the ground is wet the roller will compact the surface so that air cannot get to the roots. This ain't good! It's bad!
