The Saturday afternoon ceremony was performed by the Rev. Robert L. Turner in the Morrison chapel of the Covenant Presbyterian church, Charlotte, N. C.

A former teacher at Kingswood school Cranbrook, Betty is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George E. Simmons and her husband's parents are the B. R. Chamberlains.

Given in marriage by her father, the bride wore a gown of ivory peau de soie fashioned with an off-shoulder collar and side poplin edged in French lace, long sleeves, and a softly gathered skirt swept into a cathedral train.

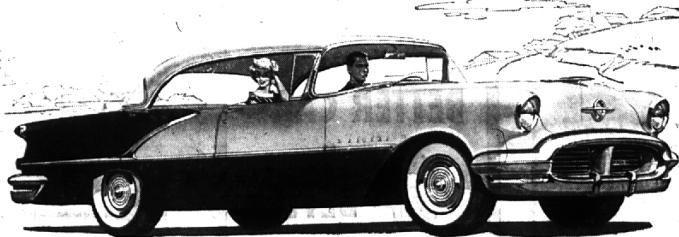
