

Pass Swimming Pool Ordinance

BLOOMFIELD TWP.—An ordinance controlling swimming pools was passed Monday night by the township board and will become effective in 30 days, according to Arno L. Hulet, township supervisor.

The law, drafted and presented by Township Attorney A. Floyd Blakelee, requires a fence at least four feet high, around each pool, with a gate that can be locked.

Pools must meet minimum side-slip requirements and can be no nearer than 50 feet to a main thoroughfare and no nearer than 25 feet to a side street.

No connections will be allowed between the pool and any public sanitary or storm sewer.

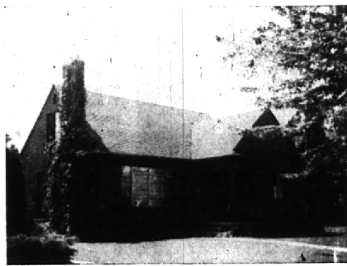

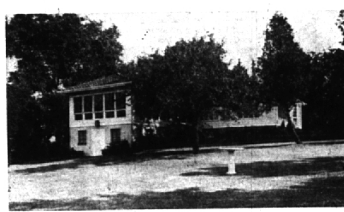

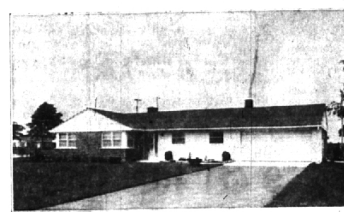
