BLOOMFIELD TWP. — Clarification of previous restrictions are needed before township board will permit a re-platting of 3 1/2 acres at Big Beaver and Adams roads, township board ruled Monday night.

Mrs. T. James LaMeasure, 750 Kensington, Birmingham, wanted to divide two lots into four lots but was told that further investigation was needed before the board could give its okay.

Sewer Problems Hold Up Approval Of Hugo Hills Plat

BLOOMFIELD TWP. — Township board withheld approval of a 78-lot plat by Hugo Hills, Inc., located on 50 acres at the corner of Opyke and E. Square Lake roads, until a sewage system was provided for the area.

Attorney for the subdividers, Jack W. Hutson, told the board he thought they had not legal reason to deny the plat's approval because sewers, if put in, would have no place to go until the Evergreen Interceptor sewer system was built.

"Who knows when that will be asked Hutson.

The board did offer Hutson approval if the subdividers would agree to putting in sewage lines when the Evergreen sewer was constructed, but Hutson turned this down, stating that if accepted, it would mean putting in septic tanks now and sewers later, causing duplication.

WHEN Hutson implied that he might take the case to court if the board denied plat approval, Trustee Albert A. Clark said, "We have an obligation—a moral obligation to the people of this township, to maintain requirements."

"When the (Evergreen) sewer comes through, if you fellows will agree to connecting up then, I'd agree to approving the plat," said Supervisor Arno L. Hull.

This same plat has been turned down twice before, once on grounds that the lots were too small, and later because of this same problem of sewers.

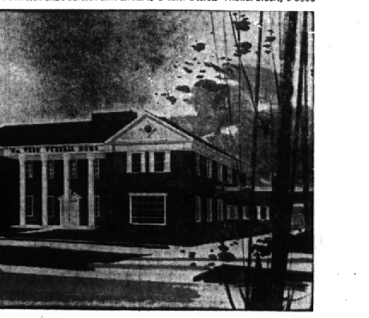
