

Students Learn How to Pack for College, Choose Luggage to Serve Double Purpose



COLLEGE BEGINS AT HOME, and it starts with careful packing. First step: make a list of everything to go into the luggage and check it against the assembled items to be sure nothing is omitted.

For students going away to college, what to take, how to pack it and what to pack it in are subjects that come first in the fall curriculum.

Selection of luggage shares top interest with choice of clothing. The trip to college, frequent visits home and overnight jaunts mean that luggage must be sturdy yet not heavy or bulky.

In dormitories, suitcases and trunks double as closet and storage space, so roominess and such fittings as elasticated curtains or removable trays are important considerations.

Basic luggage needs of college men may be answered by a suitcase bag, companion case and brief or attache case to use on campus or for overnight trips. College girls will want a Pullman or wardrobe case, a train or cosmetic box and a week-end bag.

Good planning before packing helps Eds and Co-Eds arrive at college with all belongings present and accounted for and in good condition.

First, a list should be made of everything to go in the luggage. Then, all items should be assembled, checked and double-checked against the list.

Carrying hats and shoes in individual cases helps to simplify packing problems, as does a duffel bag for sports equipment and books.

Plastic bags for sweaters, blouses and other garments give protection en route and are always useful in keeping clothes fresh and wrinkle-free.

THE TREND toward lighter and brighter colors gathers momentum for the swing into the fall and winter seasons. Charcoals are well on their way out to make room for the newly favored shades of Cambridge and banker's gray, tan, olive gray, green and blue.

In sportswear, the overall casual look has been replaced by a stylish, tailored feeling, which despite its dressed up appearance, still gives a maximum of comfort.

Ivy League type blazer-stripes are a major fashion highlight in fall sports jackets, in which the lighter weight fabrics are strongly favored.

Waist length and finger-tip length jackets and short overcoats will rate high among college men this fall.

IN THE waist length jackets, top honors will go to the zip-front models in lightweight worsted fabrics, with check or shadow plaid designs. In fingertip length jackets, the favored fabrics will be covert tweed, flannel, gabardine and melton.

The wool sweater retains its strong popularity with college men this fall, with the long-sleeved crew neck sweaters still at the top of the list. The color story is two-fold, with bold tones (mainly bright red, yellow and blue) vying with olive-tone greens and smoke grays.

For special occasion wear, flannel suits, some with subtle over-stripes or checks, in medium tones of brown or gray, look handsome. A separate tweed sport coat, when worn with the flannel slacks, provides another suit for dress-up occasions.
