### Beautiful Roses

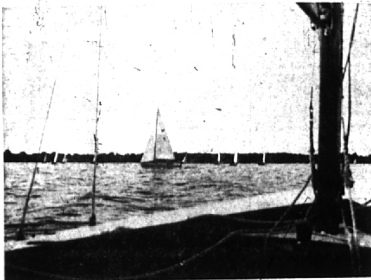
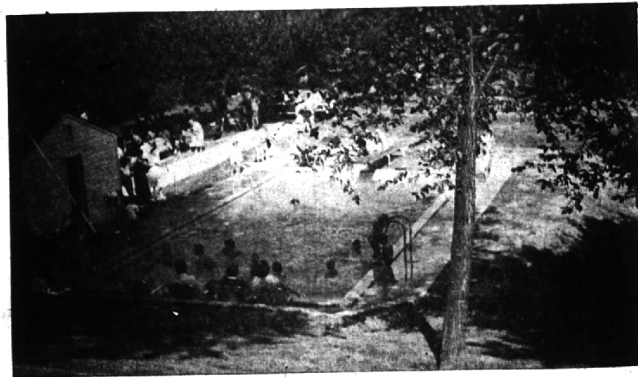

**NOTICE OF LAST DAY OF REGISTRATION SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 2, FRACTIONAL, TOWNSHIPS OF BLOOMFIELD, TROY AND WEST BLOOMFIELD, AND CITY OF BLOOMFIELD HILLS, COUNTY OF OAKLAND, MICHIGAN FOR A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 10, 1956**

**TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF SAID SCHOOL DISTRICT:**

Please Take Notice that a Special Election will be held in said School District on Monday, September 10, 1956.

Act 269, Public Acts of Michigan, 1955, as amended, provides as follows:

"The Inspectors of Election at any annual or special election shall not receive the vote of any person residing in a registration school district whose name is not registered as an elector in the city or township in which he resides . . ."

**THE LAST DAY** on which persons may register with the appropriate city or township clerk in order to be eligible to vote at the Special Election to be held on September 10, 1956, is Friday, August 31, 1956. Persons registering after 5:00 o'clock p.m., Eastern Standard Time, on said Friday, August 31, 1956, will not be eligible to vote at said Special School Election.

Under the provisions of Act 269, Public Acts of Michigan, 1955, as amended, registrations will not be taken by school officials, and only persons who have registered as general electors with the appropriate city or township clerk of the city or township in which they reside are registered school electors. Persons planning to register with the city or township clerk must ascertain the days and hours on which the clerk's office is open for registration.

This Notice is given by order of the Board of Education of School District No. 2, Fractional, Townships of Bloomfield, Troy and West Bloomfield, and City of Bloomfield Hills, County of Oakland, Michigan.
