

Eye Evans Ditch For Flood Relief

SOUTHFIELD—Gateway Construction Co., owners of property at the southeast corner of 13 Mile and Southfield known as Leavenworth Heights, have made arrangements with Oakland county drain commission to enlarge an open drain to relieve flooding in that area, according to Eugene Swem, township supervisor.

Plans, okayed Tuesday night by the township board, call for enlarging a ditch to a depth of five feet along 13 Mile road from just east of Rutland to Southfield, then north (this part to be covered) to the Evans ditch which flows to the west. Part of the ditch will be enlarged to handle the storm water. Gateway Co. had been denied building permits until they eliminate flooded conditions near the 13 Mile-Southfield intersection.

Trustee Wagner Wants Meeting to Realign Budget

SOUTHFIELD—Trustee Luther Wagner called for a budget review meeting in an effort to bring Southfield's spending in line

with a decreased budget and lagging tax revenues.

Board set Oct. 16 for the review date at which time they must decide what expenses will be cut or eliminated to make up \$80,000 which was cut from their 1956-57 budget by the county allocation board.

Supervisor Eugene Swem said available funds should have been exhausted last week but \$24,054 in State intangibles taxes arrived to keep the township budget in order.

Dams Would Make Water Impounding Area in Southfield

SOUTHFIELD—An impounding area for flood waters may be constructed on 200 acres of Section 24 along Greenfield road, if Royal Oak, Berkley and Oak Park can get county highway department approval to build a dam on road right-of-way and direct waters from north of 10 Mile road into the area.

Two owners of the property have agreed to the artificial reservoir which would hold water to a depth of five feet.

This is an attempt to relieve basement flooding in the easterly communities as well as Southfield, according to Eugene Swem, township supervisor.
