"Central" Intercepts Calls To Local Numbers Being Changed To MI-6

Persons currently dialing a Midwest 4 exchange may find themselves talking to one of Michigan Bell's operators, rather than the person they were calling—due to a change of many Midwest 4 numbers to Midwest 6.

Until the new telephone directories come out Dec. 1, Midwest 4 numbers that have been changed will be intercepted in the Bell offices when a call is made and the correct exchange will be given to the person calling.

The reason behind the change, according to Manager Al Warner, is to keep up with the expanding number of calls that go through

the Birmingham offices. Both Liberty and Midwest 4 calls formerly went to one department.

Now, with the growing number of Liberty numbers and the addition of about 1200 Lincoln numbers now going through this department, the facilities there cannot continue to handle the Midwest 4 calls as well, he said.

For that reason, Warner explained, Midwest 4 numbers are being changed to Midwest 6, which has facilities capable of handling a larger number of calls.

The intercepts which now cuts in on all Midwest 4 numbers that have been changed will continue to intercept the new numbers until the 1957 directories come out, Warner said.

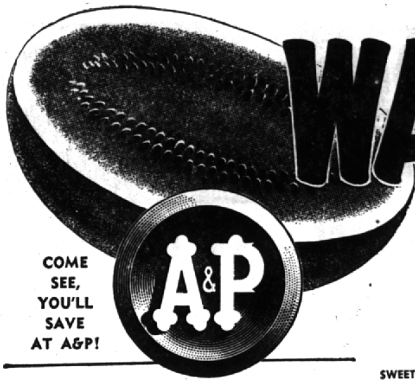
