

Up Substitute Teachers' Pay In Bloomfield

BLOOMFIELD—Substitute teachers for Bloomfield Hills school district will receive \$20 a day, school board members decided last week. The raise from \$16 puts the Bloomfield Hills substitute teachers' salary on the same scale as Detroit.

"These women put in a 16-hour day," observed board member David W. Lee who proposed the 100% increase, "and that's a long time for them to be away from their families."

While Bloomfield Hills school district does not accept tuition students generally, it set tuition rates for those students who will be moving into the district within the school year. Legal maximum rates of \$267.72 for elementary students and \$324.93 for secondary students were set by the board.

Transportation problems, baby sitting difficulties, payroll deductions made it difficult to get substitute teachers for Bloomfield Hills schools, superintendent Eugene Johnson told school board members.

Ten school buses, each making a double run, will transport Bloomfield Hills school district students this year. Data regarding bus routes and stops for picking up school children was mailed to parents this week. Over 800 children will ride school buses this year. This evening in the Bloomfield Hills school district election Sept. 10, previous rate of pay was \$1.00 an hour.

Hills high school cafeteria, school board members and faculty will hold an annual dinner.
