A student of English since she was 12, Ritva, a B plus student, is a little shy. When Bill Mueller, a Wayne University student, laughs because she calls "Wes" she is overcome by confusion. When the entire family explains the American expression "cute," Ritva is happy again.

AFTER GRADUATION with the Southfield seniors next June, Ritva must return to Finland for another year of schooling before she is finished with our equivalent of high school. She plans then to go with eight years of study to become an architect.

Books, American and commonplaces are great novelties to Ritva. Since her arrival in Detroit Aug. 20, she has enjoyed hot dogs, hamburgers and waffles with a typical teen-age appetite.

Mrs. Mueller has taken Ritva shopping and now has a new appreciation of the American market. Ritva's eyes dart everywhere, seeing new and exciting things strange to Finland. Her first purchase was a fluffy petticoat.

UNFORTUNATELY one flaw has occurred to dampen Ritva's spirit. During the excitement of arrival at the bus station, one of her large pieces of baggage disappeared. The bag contained most of her school clothing, her spending money and shoes in a new costume. So far no trace of the bag has been found.

Ritva is one of the 34 exchange students from all over the world who will study in Michigan this year. The American Field Service is sponsoring more than 700 students in the United States. Southfield Rotary Club paid her traveling expenses from New York City.

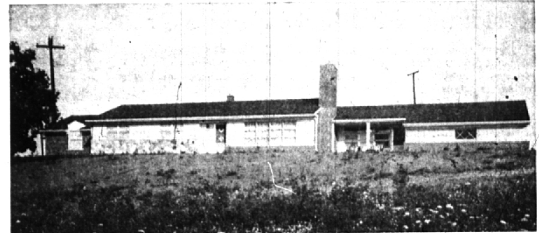
