 One hundred forty-four students, along with summer school students, who also qualify, will be honored at a dinner given by President John A. Hannah when they return to school in the fall.

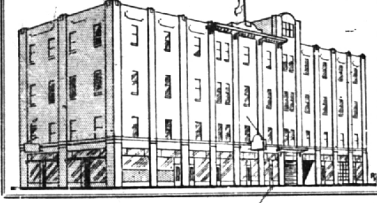
State Police To Examine Applicants
